College Courses for CSS Students.

Why take a CSS-CU or College Now Course?

- ★ Explore an academic or career interest, including classes not offered at CSS e.g. psychology, Korean, business, astrophysics, community health, medieval studies.
- ★ Add rigor to your transcript & show colleges you are ready to do college-level work!
- ★ Demonstrate your passion for an extracurricular area.
- ★ Receive college credit, depending on the policy of college you attend

The COLLEGE NOW Program




College Now is a city-wide program that enables high school students to attend classes on a CUNY campus.

CSS has a partnership with City College (CCNY). Students can take classes at other CUNY campuses, (many CSS students attend Baruch, Hunter and John Jay).

The CSS-CU Program



CSS students take classes alongside Columbia University undergraduates, as part of a special partnership with CU!

CSS-CU students are treated just like regular CU undergraduates and are expected to meet the same high academic expectations.









These are among the most competitive **COLLEGE** students in the country (a 5.9% admit rate).

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS & PROCEDURES

CSS-CU's program criteria are understandably rigorous...

For all high school students, semester grades in every subject must be 85% or higher. In addition:

- ★ Freshmen: 95% or higher core GPA** (eligible to apply in 2nd semester for admission for fall of their 10th grade year)
- ★ Sophomores: 90% or higher core GPA
- ★ Juniors: 85% or higher
- ★ Seniors: 85% or higher
 Senior applicants can only apply in Nov. for Spring courses.

**Core GPA is the average of the four CSS core subjects: Math, Science, ELA, Social Studies. Average will be rounded to the nearest whole number

Students who meet GPA requirements in a given semester will receive an invitation to apply for CSS-CU courses during the following semester to take a class in the semester to follow.

Let's say...

I'm a Freshman in 2019-2020 (now!). I have a core GPA from Fall of 2019 of 96%, so I will be invited during the Spring of 2020 to apply for a course that I would be taking in the Fall of 2020.

If you are invited, the steps are....

- (1) Students are emailed an information form they must fill out. APPLICANTS MUST ADHERE TO DEADLINES!
- (2) Submitted applications are then reviewed by a CSS-CU Committee that includes CSS administration and teachers. Attendance, punctuality, behavior in class, academic integrity, and maturity are all taken into account when reviewing a student's application.
- (3) You will be then notified by email of the outcome.

Important Note: Students need to maintain their core GPA and all core grades at CSS in the semester following their eligibility and invitation. If they do not... they will be withdrawn from CU course. Know own eligibility!

AVAILABLE COURSES

Intro Level Courses for Sophomores & Recommended for New-to-CSS-CU Students:

- ★ Elementary or First-Year Language (or level student places into)
- ★ ASTRX1753 Life in the Universe or ASTRX1754 Stars, Galaxies, and Cosmology
- ★ ECONX1003 Introduction to Economic Reasoning
- ★ ANTHV1007 The Origins of Human Society or ANTH1003 The Interpretation of Culture
- ★ UN1002 Fundamentals of Music (recommended music background)

Other important things to know about course selection...

- ★ Returning CSS-CU students may apply for progressively challenging courses.
- ★ Writing, Literature, and Engineering courses are not open to our students.
- ★ Other courses have specific rules (i.e. students cannot take Introto to Philosophy).
- * Students select three course choices and the committee decides.
- ★ Only math courses can sub in for HS graduation requirements.
- **★** ALL STUDENTS MUST TAKE MATH FOR ALL SEMESTERS OF HIGH SCHOOL.



Please note: students may be subject to waitlists and lotteries, and are not guaranteed admission to a class just by being accepted by the CSS-CU Committee.

What happens once students are admitted?

Admitted students are expected to...

- ★ Attend all courses and complete all homework (even if not graded)
- ★ Use supports as needed office hours, math help rooms, libraries, etc.
- ★ Communicate with AP Manriquez-Weiner & Prof. Thomas if any challenges.

Admitted students...

- ★ Will controll their own registration (CSS cannot access!)
- ★ Will receive a CUID and access to CU facilities and resources
- ★ Must attend an orientation at the university (first time CSS-CU students)
- ★ Will be provided CSS-CU courses and books FREE OF CHARGE thanks to Friends of Columbia Secondary School! (must pay if not returned...)

Also: Students must earn a B- or higher in a CSS-CU course to be eligible to participate in CSS-CU in the following semester.



Last but not least: some colleges, but not all, will accept credits from the CSS-CU program. Funny enough, Columbia itself will not accept these.
