- 1. Call to order & Welcome Janiz Soriano & Cathleen Roque, Co-Presidents
 - Co-presidents Janiz Soriano and Cathleen Roque called the meeting to order at 6:22 pm with 46 participants.
 - 2. Catherine showed highlights of what the PTA has funded in this past month.
 - Parent donations have allowed the award-winning "CSS Harlem Rails Robotics Club" to thrive and join robotics teams from all over NYC for the unveiling of NYC's 1st 2024 Robotics Competition game!
 - CSS Cheerleading Team came in 2nd place at their first ever USA/UCA Cheer Competition sponsored by the National Cheer Association. The PTA purchased their new uniforms. The team's next public appearance will be at the Columbia vs Brown Men's Basketball game at Columbia University on Feb 23, 2024.
 - For supporting the CSS Winter Showcase: PTA provided pizza, and every student played one of the 400 jingle bells - thanks to the grant from last year!
 - Holiday Gift Bags to all of our faculty and staff PTA volunteers gathered on 12/21 to create 102 gift bags for every person that works with our kids (teachers, staff, paras, aides, after school, cafeteria workers, security agent, custodians, etc). Messages of thanks were shared.

- Superintendent Davenport was in attendance this month.
- Harlem International Museum, Executive Director, Donald Clayton who has been a resident of Harlem for over 40yrs was the meetings soul presenter and discussed the need for NYC to have it's first and needed African American Museum. He was inquiring for D5 support.

8. FACILITIES REPORT - Space Sharing

- STORAGE Administration successfully held onto CSS storage space that custodians wanted for storage displaced by boiler project. (They will now use pool locker rooms.)
- SHARED SPACE COMMITTEE Second meeting of year has not been scheduled yet.



- BUILDING UTILIZATION PLAN Continuing to talk to DOE, Citywide Council on High Schools, CEC5, Borough President and other officials to plead for a BUP for our building.
- SCHOOLYARD Administration reports additional time has been secured for lunchtime field use on Tues and Thurs in addition to Wed. Still a work in progress.
- NEW BUILDING Continuing periodic communications with District and others to push for a long-term solution given that three growing schools cannot fit in our current building.
- NOTE: challenging to get anyone to respond to solving the above issues.
- Pictures shared
 - School building in 1923 (original capacity of 500 students, today's population is 1325 students)
 - ii. Front of the building to show that we've requested the repair of the high-mounted floodlights on the building facade to reduce dark areas.
 - 1. There was immediate response that discussed immediate replacement of lights by the doors, however we are requesting that these floodlights get repaired.
 - 2. Also told that the SCA will add lights to their trailers to help.
 - 3. Will continue to press to have the floodlights replaced.
- Updates from the School Construction Authority
 - i. BOILER REPLACEMENT Ongoing until February 2026. \$27,348,705 budget
 - ii. POOL Scope completed. Beginning design. No dates. \$7,750,000 budget
 - iii. BASEMENT CAFETERIA Scope completed. Beginning design. No dates. \$550,000 budget
 - 1. We're pressing to get this project moving, especially over the summer.
 - iv. SCAFFOLD To be removed over next two weeks
- WE STILL HAVE 3 PROJECTS AND AT LEAST 4 YEARS TO GO!
 - i. You can help by sending a letter to the SCA to encourage them to expedite remaining projects and provide better communication.

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9. PRINCIPAL REPORT

- Gave thanks to the parents for the Holiday Gift Bags. Was the largest bag received as a DOE employee, and all the staff was just as appreciative.
- Parent Engagement Sessions happened on Jan 8, 2024. [Coffee with the principal]
 - i. First couple of sessions were only about 15, but we'd like to continue to grow these sessions.
 - ii. Good to hear from the parents and their concerns, and good for parents to hear the administration challenges.
 - iii. Haven't decided on the next date, but encourage parents to attend.
- We gained more usage time on the playground detail will be given by AP Lynn.
 - i. Can now have 3 lunch periods.
 - ii. Per Dr. Lynn Increased the field times on Tues & Thurs in period 6, splitting with PS125
 - iii. Next year will start from scratch with space utilization.
- Math Department unrolled new calculators in their classes. These are way more intuitive and we hope that it will help students.
- SONYC has started offering Pickleball.
 - i. Have purchased the equipment by the PhysEd department, and made available to after school
 - ii. Hope that this grows and we're able to create a team in the future.
- We got an approval for Boys Volleyball Varsity PSAL team
 - i. Agreement signed today.
 - ii. Have a great girls' team but always an aspiration for a boys team
- We are working with a very reputed Golf organization to start Golf PSAL team
 - i. This is a great organization, and our kids will go to very prof golf courses, transportation provided by the organization
 - ii. Still working on the approval
- More lighting around the school perimeter
 - i. Per Facilities report still working; the corner of the building is still dark, which is where the most of the crime has happened.
- Precinct 26 has promised increased presence in the Morningside Park and around the school at the time of late dismissal.
 - i. Invited the Police security here and have agreed to increase police presence in the park and near the school during dismissal hours.
 - ii. This can change if they have more pressing priorities but we're hoping that we can hold them to this.

iii.

- We are going to deploy NYC DOE GAMA for emergency alerts going forward
 - i. We explored other options but this service seems the most promising.

- ii. After School is challenging as there is only one administrator in the building, however during the school day is easier.
- iii. This will allow for real time messages to be sent, and then followed up by email.
- Bathroom Toilet Paper Issue has been resolved.
 - i. New fixtures and more regular monitoring
- Morningside restorative circles training has been discussed and finalized. They will start with the 6th grade early next semester.
 - i. Social and emotional learning, and restorative talks
 - ii. Will start with the 6th grade early Feb and then work to get to other grades.
- o CRESAL funding provided a yoga session for CSS, as wells as 50 yoga mats.
 - There is a day of wellness scheduled tomorrow, Wed 1/11, email sent via lsis.
- We are looking to install more hydration stations.
 - i. Designs we have are not workable, but will work to duplicate the service that we have in the basement.
 - ii. Will be good for everyone, to reduce waste.
- Debate and Cheer teams have won big accolades.
 - i. Cheer team news via PTA earlier.
 - ii. Debate team
- We had a very well attended and a very festive Winter Celebration.
 - i. Was great to see student participation and celebration.
- We got to keep our Gym balcony space that SCA threatened to take.
 - i. Facilities report confirmed that we were able to keep this space, in order for storage.
 - ii. Will work to reorganize and maximize the space.
 - iii. Per Dr. Lynn Got to keep things in the balcony. Asked if the pool could be used to store things, and got answer YES!
- AP Gordon will deliver a SPED Engagement session on Jan 11, 2024 at 6 PM.
 - i. Lots of parents from SPED have concerns
 - ii. This isn't a session for specifics to be discussed due to privacy concerns, but will distribute a form prior.
- Students taking Columbia Classes for credit this Spring semester is 27.
 - i. Last year was 7
 - ii. There was limited offering and hesitation from professors to have minors
 - iii. Also option to get college courses from CUNY, SUNY and other colleges in the city.
 - iv. Increases are coming but not as fast as we'd like.
- We are on track for providing office hours during Spring Semester
 - i. Community has expressed interest in this.



- ii. Are assessing faculty availability per student access.
- Frost Valley preparation coming along.
 - i. PArora joining the 8th Grade for this trip!
- Black Studies Curriculum
 - We decided to join Prof McGuiness and include this curriculum within the History curriculum.
 - ii. He's already started prof development in the district.
- Private Office Space per Dr. Lynn, we're beginning the process of building private office space (acoustical panels that go to ceiling); work to start in 409
 - i. PArora and DLynn have meeting on Thurs to work on offices in 507 and to subdivide a former classroom to be more efficient space, esp with upcoming class size cap (trying to get ahead of this)
- Basement Cafeteria per Dr. Lynn, PS125 principal received communication that they'll start over the summer and complete prior to start of Fall 2024
 - 1. Once done, the 6th floor cafeteria will have much more availability and allow for our students to have more access
- Virtual Learning per Dr. Lynn, We've been approved for school based virtual learning.
 - 1. More info coming out in the coming days.
 - 2. Allows us to offer a health and art credit in the spring log on in the evening or afternoon online.
 - 3. Current plan is that Attridge will offer an interdisciplinary course on the BEATLES in music.
- Q pickleball lines, can lines be taped will ask phys ed, as this sounds like a
 great idea. More important to get the courts, so we'll have 4.
 - i. Parent Mariana Marron requested to have more detailed discussion at the next meeting.
 - ii. PArora thinks we can move faster than the February meeting.
- Q folks asked about Futsol Someone came by to discuss, is a great idea, and would be good to have in the winter. Need to ensure that we're in DOE compliance. Will continue the conversation. Also inquiring about badminton in the future.
- Q who is the contact person to reach out to regarding request for new sports?
 PArora send an email to Dean DeLucia but copy PArora to make sure it gets processed.
- Q is it true that the 6th grade is going from 4 sections to 3? A child was told this
 by the teacher, but no communication to the parents. PArora it was discussed
 at the last SLT.
 - i. The MS classes should be maxed at 33. We were forced to create 4 when the 6th grade class had more than 99 (108 this year).



- ii. Now that we're back down to 99 with 4 sections, it looks like we have more seats than the building can accommodate so the DOE can add students that aren't screened.
- iii. 4 sections ate up lots of teacher resources. Now we'll be able to re-allocate and bring us into compliance and equalize the teacher load.
- iv. Will also prevent the DOE from adding more students.
- v. Will have new intermingling of students so they have new sets of friends, but done carefully in collaboration with the teachers in order to keep friends.
- vi. Per Dr. Lynn as we organize the 6th grade, we've moved Prof Carter from Philosophy to Science and Prof Sears will be joining the Math/Physics course in upper grades in order to have an ICT credit.
- Q re: 10th grade physics, who is teaching the Math/Physics class? Prof Kovac is teaching both sections of the class that had 2 teachers.
 - i. This class is popular among students and help with their credit load.
- Q has the NYPD made specific commitments about their policing of the CSS area? The NYPD is reluctant to put anything on paper, but they have assured CSS & PS125 that they'll be around dismissal much more at 5:45 & 6:15, when after school lets out and there's a true lack of staffing. (at regular dismissal we're good with safe dismissal as we have more staff available then.)
- Q can we do a test of the emergency alert, and can this also be sent to the students? Doing a test of the emergency alert is a great idea. Regarding sending to students, PArora is in favor of sending to high school students as they are more mature and can handle the alerts, but have had mixed feelings about sending to middle school students who should probably hear from their parents.
 - i. PArora would like to hear from the PTA on how the parent body feels about this.
 - ii. The alert will use the parent info that is registered on the DOE NYSchools account, so please make sure this is updated.
 - iii. If you have 800#s blocked, you'll need to turn this off so you receive the alert.
 - iv. The number is the same for all alerts, so parents can save this to their contacts.
 - v. The admin will send out an email prior to the test being sent out, sometime next week.
- Q any report update of the parent who was injured in the attempted robbery near the school last week? Unfortunately no. The NYPD admitted that there have been 3 robberies in the last 3 weeks, and it's suspected to be the same group of adolescents from the vicinity.
 - i. Since they are minors, they aren't able to hold them, and they are released soon afterwards.



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- ii. Q were the students provided counseling after watching a video of suicide? Yes, they were provided guidance right after the incident.
 - 1. AP Gorden and Admin working with Sonic to have more oversight in After School supervision.



Superintendent Davenport was in attendance this month. He is in the process of visiting our districts schools for introductions with the principals & visited CSS on Tuesday 12/5/23. Largest enrollment of the school year is Columbia Secondary School. There are currently 24 teacher vacancies in D5, 15 are special education vacancies. There are 935 English Language Learners in the district and that population has grown due to our migrant population.

Office of Food and Nutrition Services (OFNS), D5 Supervisor, Brittany Garcia presented. She visited CSS 11/14/23. If the CSS community is interested in having Halal & Kosher menus please let our school administrators know so that they can fill out an application form for these services...

Our Parent Coordinator Isis Ramos responded to the districts invitation and attend this meeting. She was formally introduced to the district council members and answered any questions pertaining to her role at CSS. SPACE SHARING

SHARED SPACE COMMITTEE - Held first meeting, reviewed space sharing schedules. Note: CSS doing much better than past years, overall (inside) is close to 55% share expectation. But...

BUILDING UTILIZATION PLAN - ...without a BUP we will continue to experience problems. Continuing to talk to DOE, Citywide Council on High Schools, CEC5, Borough President and other officials regarding the lack of a BUP. Very hard to get attention despite being one of only 12 high school buildings in Manhattan that is overcrowded, no uniform bell schedule, K-12 mix, etc.

AFTERSCHOOL - We clarified that afterschool use should be proportional to program size.

SCHOOLYARD - Past policy assigned yard time on days a school did not have a primary gym day. But because CSS is almost always in one of the gyms (as we should be based on our size), we are assigned only **one day per week** on the new turf field. This is not adequate or equitable – we are working with the administration to revise this.

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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - Safety Incident

Police was called upon.

RBS principal was involved right away

Police was in the school till past 8 PM

Subpoenas were issued for information

We complied

DOE legal restrained us from divulging case details. However on urging that we need to intimate parents, they gave us pre-approved communication.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - Safety Incident

We were hyper vigilant. We tried to get scanning right away but the entire scanning unit was busy due to stabbing incidents at schools in Brooklyn and the Bronx.

We had police presence at the main entrance all day.

We finally got scanning due to the intervention of our precinct 26 Captain Jose
Taveras [who has been very helpful throughout]

The day of the scanning he told the PTA president and me that the threat was not deemed credible but complemented us for taking it so seriously.

We had police support on Friday too

On Monday, we approached the detective to see if the case was close, but got no response.

Today close to noon, we were told the case is closed.


